	<p>would continue to rise going forward.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Victim Satisfaction – Excellent progress this month with over 85% of victims in Warwickshire satisfied with their experience with the Force. • Hate Crime – OPCC had received an update on the increase in reported hate crime post recent events. An increase in these figures was viewed as positive, indicating trust and confidence. All hate crime was dealt with robustly and was a priority for the Force. • Missing Persons – The significant increase seen at the beginning of 2016/17 were the result of recording changes introduced in April 2016. It was noted that the MASH was currently finalising a joint protocol for children missing from homes and care which all partners would be signed up to. Work was in progress on how to better manage demand. • Sexual Offences – The Force were confident that their response to rape was extremely robust to very challenging, complex and protracted investigations. It was noted that Warwickshire were first in the Most Similar Force Group for outcomes. • Public Order – Work was ongoing across the Alliance to understand the rise in figures. 	<p>RP/NH to organise a visit to Victims Management Unit</p> <p>DISCHARGED</p>
