

2/12/2017	<b>Actions Arising from Previous Minutes :-</b>	
	<p><b>Anti-Social Behaviour</b></p> <p>MJ gave update on the successful partnership work that had been undertaken to deal with the increase in Anti-Social Behaviour, in particular to children on bikes in the North of the County. The issue had now subsided.</p>	<b>Discharged</b>
3/12/2017	<p><b>Leadership Roadshows</b></p> <p>MJ reported that the Force would be scheduling staff roadshows in the Spring of 2018 which would give people an opportunity to talk about the policing model and key issues.</p>	<b>Discharged</b>

4/12/2017	<p><b>Shooting in Stratford upon Avon</b></p> <p>MJ reported that a man had been arrested and charged with the shooting in Stratford upon Avon.</p>	<b>Discharged</b>
5/12/2017	<p><b>Good News Story – Nuneaton Officer</b></p> <p>MJ reported that an Officer in Nuneaton had been filmed by a member of the public taking two homeless people into McDonalds and buying them lunch – which had then been uploaded onto social media.</p>	<b>Discharged</b>
6/12/2017	<p><b>Performance Update – ACC Richard Moore</b></p> <p>ACC RM gave a verbal update to the questions raised by RP following the November Force Performance report. The following was noted:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Although the rise in reported crime across Warwickshire was in line with national trends and similar forces – that rise was now slowing significantly (vehicle crime and burglary both reduced) Crime Data Integrity was still an issue for the Force and RM confirmed that work was ongoing to ensure proper assessments were being implemented. RM to report back on progress.</li> <li>• In relation to the vulnerability markers it was noted that the introduction of Athena had changed crime recording processes and RM assured PS that there had not been any change in the level of reporting or confidence in police response.</li> <li>• November had seen a significant reduction (20%) in the number of vehicle crimes across the county when compared to October with Operation Diorite ongoing and paying dividends.</li> <li>• It was noted that Op Cerberus had been set up to tackle drug related violence.</li> </ul> <p>RM reported that work was ongoing to re-design the performance framework and the measures that drove activity.</p> <p>RM would provide a comprehensive written response to the questions that had been posed by BP.</p>	<b>Discharged</b>
