

	<p>Rise in Crime across the County – Press Releases</p> <p>RT highlighted the significant rise in crime across the county and requested specific information on:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What successes the Force had achieved in combatting vehicle crime and burglaries. An update on both has been forwarded to the PCC. • The successful collaborative work with cross border agencies in deporting known criminals that operated within the county. 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

3/26/09/2017	<p>Crime Recording</p> <p>MJ reported that a draft paper was being prepared which would evidence the current complexities and abnormalities in the rules which all Forces were required to adhere to in the reporting and recording of crimes. MJ would be writing to both HMIC and the National Lead for crime recording.</p>	Discharged
4/26/09/2017	<p>Force Performance</p> <p>In answer to questions raised by RP on Force performance in August, when AFS reported the following on 12th September:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Domestic abuse victim satisfaction had now been included in the performance report and the findings were positive. 	Discharged
5/26/09/2017	<p>Update Briefing on HS2</p> <p>At the previous meeting on 12th September, Insp. Daff Goddard, Force Liaison Officer for HS2 reported on the progress of the project across Warwickshire and the significant policing impact of:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased traffic problems, diversions, road safety • Engagement with protest groups • Potential for increase in crime • Community cohesion at residential compounds for key workers – currently undecided locations. • Cross border liaison with West Midlands <p>It was noted that an operations planning meeting had been scheduled for October and ACC Thomas of British Transport Police would be liaising with Forces to discuss arrangements for co-ordinating strategies across Force areas to ensure a consistent approach along the route.</p> <p>An HS2 Engagement Team was now in operation which would respond to the views of communities and invite residents to meetings.</p> <p>Insp. Goddard to be invited back to this meeting in March 2018 for further update.</p> <p>It was noted at the meeting on 26th September that HS2 are arranging their own on site security. Insp. Goddard will liaise where necessary at an appropriate level and will seek to manage expectations, the high risks are theft of plant and machinery. 6/26/09/2017	<p>Recalibration of Speed Guns for Community Speedwatch</p> <p>PS/RT requested information on the procedure for recalibrating the community watch speed guns.</p>	Discharged
7/26/09/2017	<p>Quick debrief on the Vulnerability and Serious and Organised Crime event held at Dunchurch Park Hotel, on Tuesday 19th September</p> <p>This event was well organised, well attended and the discussions were most helpful. CC MJ requested the Force's thanks be noted for the leadership around that event and the operational focus. The OPCC have undertaken some high level evaluation and feedback since the event. This area around vulnerability is everyone's business and it flows through numerous aspects of the Force including the CSE teams, and working around aligning the resources into the highest demand areas.</p>	
8/26/09/2017	<p>The Rt Hon Nick Hurd, MP, Minister for Policing and Fire - Final messages following the meeting on 25th September</p> <p>PS felt the meeting had gone down well, the Minister clearly understood the message and the Force were worse off due to the current funding formula.</p>	
9/26/09/2017	<p>Visit to the Mosque in Nuneaton on 25th September</p> <p>RT reported that during a recent visit to the Mosque the feedback about SNT teams and PCSOs was complimentary. The additional reassurance patrols post Manchester were welcomed and helped members to feel more valued. The communication via Facebook was positive.</p>
