3/20/2/2018	<ul> <li>AFS provided the force response to the 'PCC's Performance Scrutiny Questions / Observations' for February 2018.</li> <li>The issue of data accuracy in certain key areas following the introduction of Athena was discussed at length. Data quality was improving as user error was diminishing, although Criminal Justice file preparation remained a focus and was being addressed by Dawn Hartland. Vulnerability reporting was now back to normal levels.</li> <li>Crime recording accuracy was not an issue, but identifying areas of particular vulnerability was currently more challenging. 'Athena User Group' was considering potential solutions.</li> <li>DPCC requested assurance that key data was available and accurate.</li> <li>The reduction in crime levels was a very positive development. AFS attributed the success of proactive initiatives and operations and was optimistic that performance would continue to improve into the new financial year.</li> <li>AFS to meet with C.Supt Mike O'Hara West Mids Police Coventry to improve x-border liaison and joint operations.</li> <li>Victim Satisfaction surveys not conducted for January which may skew the data.</li> <li>The cause of the decrease in hate crime was not known but maybe driven by national events. Reassuring that satisfaction rates remain high</li> </ul>	KM to request Mike Smith to attend PCC – CC meeting to provide additional reassurance.
