2/30/01/2018	Actions Arising from Previous Minutes :-	
	<p>PCC Consultation</p> <p>After due consideration PS would be recommending to the Police and Crime Panel to raise the council tax precept by the maximum amount from April 2018. The consultation survey resulted in a significant majority of respondents being in favour of the maximum precept increase which had helped immensely in the decision making process.</p> <p>This increase in funding was critical for Warwickshire Police with the priority for re-investment into operational policing in order to protect the people and communities of Warwickshire.</p>	Discharged
3/30/01/2018	<p>Performance Update – ACC Richard Moore</p> <p>ACC RM gave a comprehensive briefing in answer to performance questions raised by the OPCC with the following being noted:-</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Public Confidence - Warwickshire were ranked 4th in Most Similar Force data. Public remained extremely positive. • Victim Satisfaction – There had been a slight decrease over the last quarter but not statistically significant. Victim satisfaction would be at the heart of the forthcoming Leadership Seminars • Domestic Abuse Victim Satisfaction – Positive results noted. • Repeat Victims – It was noted that there had been a reduction in the number of repeat victims but assurance was given that this was a recording issue and work was ongoing to resolving those issues. • Missing Persons – This was an excellent example of collaborative working with Fire and Rescue with the use of shared specialist equipment such as lighting and water search teams. It was noted that the number of missing persons had risen dramatically in line with national trends. • Victim Support Services – It was noted that there had been a downturn in referrals to victim support and PS sought assurance from RM that work was in hand to resolve any issues with Athena. RM reported that extra resources had been brought in to reduce backlog and work was ongoing to resolve any recording issues. • Road Safety – RM to report back with comparable data from previous year in order for PS to understand the success of the 2017 Winter drink / drug driving campaign. It was noted that non-fatal KSIs had risen across the County. • Case File Quality Assessment (CFQA) – RM to provide written report to NH. • PS raised a question on the national trend of increased knife crime – RM to provide written response 	<p>RS to forward data</p> <p>RM to forward information to NH</p> <p>RM to forward information on knife-crime</p>
