	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> NEW ITEM: Letter received from Edward Argar MP, Ministry of Justice, regarding grant funding for rape and sexual abuse support services 2019-2022. <p>It was noted that a letter received from Edward Argar MP confirmed that that charities RoSA and Safeline would be receiving £257,040 and £401,082 respectively, in addition to monies already received by the PCC. Out of £24 million, Warwickshire received 3x the amount compared to other Counties.</p>	PS to respond with a letter.
3/26/03/2019	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> NEW ITEM: Force Performance <p>The following was noted:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 101 calls have dropped to 64% compared to the 80% target. It was noted that this was a nationally set target and many forces are removing it. The majority of calls are answered in under a minute, including 999 calls. It was furthermore noted that there was a correlation between 101 calls then 999 calls being made. The use of calling 999 has seen a 20% increase in the last 3 years, but only a 2% increase in 101 calls. There is a recruitment strategy in place for the OCC, with 15 vacancies, with 3 intakes of 9 people altogether. The possible use of the Incident Progression Team was discussed but not enforced. 	AFS to discuss further with MJ and Finance Officer Jeff Carruthers, and get a timeline with a projection for recruitment, also share staff survey with PS.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ It was noted that there is always a turnover in OCC environments due to fixed-term contracts, the length of vetting and training, and staff progressing to become officers.○ Crime rates: it has been a positive year, with a 1.2% year to date reduction in total recorded crime. Burglary dwellings are down 6%, business crime has reduced by 12%, but there has been a small increase in vehicle crime, and personal robbery, with 72 offences recorded so far year to date.○ Incidences of Violence without Injury is up 16.5%, however it was noted that this includes harassment, malicious communications, both online and off.○ The Harm Hub has helped with victim satisfaction, as it was noted there was a significant improvement in actions against perpetrators of Domestic Violence. As a whole, victim satisfaction was tailing but stable.○ Health and wellbeing has improved. Staff and officer sickness is down to 5.32%. A recent staff survey will be shared with PS.


