	<ul> <li>Business burglaries and 'community crime' is up 23.4%, however it was noted that this was partly due to better recording of crimes and the inclusion of other crimes such as residential garage breaks-ins and cybercrimes within this category. It was noted that house burglaries have decreased significantly.</li> <li>Rape reports are up 30%, this is due to victims being more confident in reporting their cases. It was noted that in the rare recent case of a stranger rape the perpetrator was arrested and charged quickly.</li> <li>101 calls- It was noted that the demand is now being managed better, the waiting time has dropped to 54 seconds, and the abandon rate is down to 2%. This is due to a recent intake of 9 staff members, staff being trained in both 999 and 101 call handling, a decrease in sickness absence and improved morale. Further service improvement was discussed including further recruitment.</li> <li>The current establishment stands at 850 officers, up from 810 in February. There is a further planned recruitment of 6 officers in June, 6 in July, 16 in August, 20 in September, 11 in October, and 4 in December.</li> <li>There are no transferees as of 11th June, with no transferees predicted in July, and 6 leavers predicted between June and August.</li> <li>It was noted that many PCSOs go on to become officers, and another PCSO course will run again before October.</li> <li>The current number of Specials stands at 120, with a view to increase to 210 after an additional Specials course in November.</li> <li>Next Meeting –Tuesday 18th June 2019 at WJC, Leamington Spa</li> </ul>
