


2/20/08/2019	<p><b>Matters Arising from previous minutes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ <b>Decision on digital services review 2019.</b> This was moved to the closed minutes at the request of PS.</li> <li>○ <b>National recruitment of 20,000 police officers.</b> It was noted that Warwickshire may get between 150 and 160 officers, with recruitment potentially starting in 2 years' time. Philip was given a set of confidential questions by a local councillor, and the following was noted:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Street lighting is the responsibility of Warwickshire County Council. There is no evidence to suggest that people feel safer or unsafe with the lights off. If the Police are undertaking a specific operation they can request the lights be kept on of a short time.</li> <li>• Participation in schemes such as Home watch, Neighbourhood Watch, Community Speedwatch, as well as active reporting is encouraged Residents can make a Citizen's arrest however there are legal implications. Joining the Specials would also be encouraged.</li> <li>• The Force cannot recommend individual companies to police the estate, however crime has been stable in the County for the last</li> </ul>	<b>Discharged</b>

	<p>18 months Burglary is down overall by 14% year to date, especially residential burglaries which are down 12%, vehicle crime is now down 0 9% Where crime is increasing in the rest of country, Warwickshire's rates have decreased by 7%.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• GBH is down, violence without injury (such as hate crime) has increased, and this is partly due to people being encouraged to report more hate crime</li> <li>• There are around 5-6 burglaries a day in the whole of Warwickshire</li> <li>• Many new officers will be going into the investigations department</li> <li>• Residents will need to speak to their local SNT officers regarding an increase in visibility and patrols</li> <li>• The current establishment was 800 at the start of year and will be 950 by the end of the financial year for the whole of Warwickshire</li> </ul>
