


3/05/11/2019	<p>NEW ITEM: Performance and Estates update- Alex Franklin-Smith:</p> <p>The following was noted in response to the questions posed by the IOPC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The last 12 months have shown a reduction 0.4% in crime as of 04/11/2019 Car key burglary is still high but this is a national issue Anti-social behaviour is down 20% Personal robbery is up 0.9% Violence without injury is up 12% Burglary dwelling is down 15.5% Business robbery is up 42.9% Hate crime and victim satisfaction has been stable over the last 12 months, with an 85% satisfaction rate The last 3 months 	Discharged

	<p>have seen a decrease in 3 or 4 percentage points without an increase in crime</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There has been an increase on the previous month in Domestic Abuse repeat victims from 36% to 41% This is due to an increased rate of arrests, reporting, and positive action, as well the reduced use of Section 16 (no further action) from victims Civil measures such as protection orders are still being used There has been a 5% increase in Domestic Abuse victims in the criminal justice system, and 20% of overall crime nationally is Domestic Abuse related • Child at risk- North Warwickshire has exceeded the upper limit of child at referrals due to higher rates of recording • Violence without injury The national figures show an increase of 12.4% year to date, with around 700-750 extra offences It was noted that the 'violence without injury' term is an umbrella term with many new offences being placed under this category, such as social media harassment and malicious communications Warwickshire's recording of this currently stand at 93% accuracy It is estimated to become more stable towards the end of the year • Business crime- this remains within the control limits, and a north/south divide was noted, with 55% reporting rate in North Warwickshire and 45% in the South This includes crimes such as shoplifting and fraud It was noted that PS has recently granted funding for radios to be provided to shopkeepers in Rugby to help reduce shoplifting
