1. Summary of the application

To fund the first cohort of recipients of the PCC Road Safety Grant 2019-20.

2. Background information:

The first PCC Road Safety Grant launched for applications in May 2019. The PCC made available up to £500,000 for the grant round. The aim is to enhance road safety in Warwickshire in order to protect people from harm, reduce and prevent crime, ensure efficient and effective policing, and put victims and survivors first.

The criteria for applications was broad although the decision was taken not to fund engineering projects, this being a Warwickshire County Council area of responsibility. The PCC Road Safety Grant will focus on engagement and prevention, with some enforcement, but it will not fund engineering initiatives.

Over 40 applications were received and 11 have been recommended for funding, totalling £325,774.02. The approved projects focus on victim support, youth engagement, motorcyclist engagement, and some speed enforcement.
