£50, 000 in small grants was made available to organisations to bid for up to £10, 000 per project. A £15, 000 Reducing Reoffending fund for a single countywide project was also made available.

In total, we received 28 applications, 6 of which were for the Reducing Reoffending fund. Some were automatically excluded from the evaluation process because they were not for Warwickshire projects or because they did not meet countywide selection criteria for the RR bid category.

A full breakdown of those projects we have chosen to award and how they might contribute to the Police and Crime Plan can be seen in the attached spreadsheet. For those bids which were not successful, information on why they were not successful has been stored as part of the evaluation process.
