2/28/04/2020	Outstanding matters from previous meetings: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There were no outstanding matters from last week's meeting. 	Discharged
3/28/04/2020	NEW ITEM: COVID19 related matters <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ease of lockdown. MJ sent the response times for 999 and 101 calls to PS as requested. There is no indication on when the lockdown will be eased from Central Government as yet. It was noted that response times for emergency calls are noted in the weekly report from Steve Russell. • GR 53/2020: Coronavirus (COVID-19) update- questions from Policy Lead Zeynab Gamielien regarding local arrangements for the early release of prisoners and how they will be managed in Warwickshire. The following was noted: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ RM has received an update from Andy Wade regarding the early release of prisoners which has been sent to PS. It was noted that all services have a good working relationship and this was reflected at the LCJB and last week and with regional staff. ○ There are 3 cohorts being considered for early release: 	Ongoing

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Mother and babies▪ Medically vulnerable▪ Low and medium risk prisoners nearing with 2 months of their sentence left to serve.○ All prisoners will be electronically monitored and a full risk assessment for anyone on a temporary licence.○ There is no exact criteria as yet, but it will not include those under the MAPA process, sexual, or violent offenders.○ A lack of suitable housing will also be a barrier for release as it will put strain on other services. Prisoners will be released to suitable accommodation and not a Police Station. <ul style="list-style-type: none">● COVID19- staff absence, crime levels, testing, and firearms. <p>The following was noted:</p> <p>Staff absence:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Total officer absence is between 5 and 6 % including normal sickness levels.● Total staff absence is 14-15% including those working from home.● There has been no significant impact on the Force. <p>Crime levels:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Crime levels are 30% down.● There has been an increase of drug dealer arrests.● 999 demand is down.● 101 has increased.● Domestic Violence is consistent and reporting levels have not changed. National support organisations have seen a 50% increase in contact● Google data has been provided for the County on people's activity and movement. It has shown fewer trips and less activity overall, although use of public parks has increased. The public are driving to Coombe Abbey despite the car park being closed, resulting in them parking on a dangerous road. ACC Tedds is monitoring usage and any community tensions. Highways England data has seen a 10% increase in traffic on the roads over the last 7 days.● The Home Office have requested a report of Force activity, including the issuing of penalty notices and encouragement of the 3Es. Warwickshire are currently in the bottom 5 five forces for issuing fines; this does not account for the size of population or Force.● 9 penalty notices were issued over the weekend.● A survey of 102 people found that 75% were fully supportive of the Force's COVID19 policy, with around 6-7% stating it needs to be tougher. <p>Testing:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● All keyworkers displaying symptoms are now being tested and there has been a surge in demand, with many online applications not being responded to as the website crashed.	
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	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The testing facility at the RICOH arena is still underused.• Partners of officers also have to self-isolate for 14 days.
