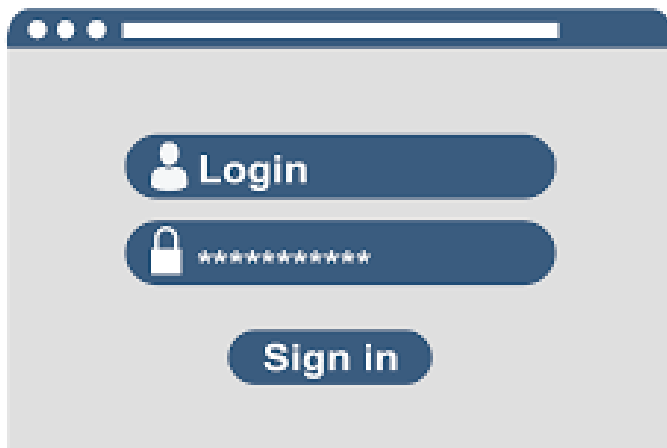


Passwords





Passwords are very important.

If someone knows your passwords, they can pretend to be you. This is called 'Identity Theft'.

To help keep your passwords safe:

	<p>Do not write passwords down</p> <p>Only use hints</p>
	<p>Don't make passwords that are easy to guess</p> <p>Create 'strong' passwords</p>
	<p>Don't use the same password on different accounts</p>
	<p>Don't tell anyone your full password</p>
	<p>Use '2 factor authentication' when possible</p>

strong passwords

Passwords that use any mix of:

- capital letters DOG
- lowercase letters blue
- numbers 34696
- special characters £\$&@*#
- 3 random words DogBlueHoodie

2 factor authentication

Protection is done by using a password & then a random code that is sent to your mobile phone
