4	<p><b><u>Establishment and Recruitment</u></b></p> <p>A briefing was given by the Head of Human Resources (AH) with the following noted:-</p> <p><b>Police Officers</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Above establishment but tracking in line with predictions at 1066.</li> <li>• On track for leaver numbers at 9.</li> <li>• There were presently no plans for transferees, but this would be kept under review.</li> <li>• Uplift target for next year 1100</li> <li>• Next intake will be in January / March 2022</li> <li>• Minimum university contract over 2 year is 80 students with 2 intakes per year</li> <li>• Recruitment update for next year's PCDA intake. Applications closing at the end of June 2021.</li> <li>• To date 120 applications are at various stages in the process. Out of 120 candidates there are 10 BAME and 39 female applicants.</li> <li>• Tracking higher failure rate for BAME and women candidates in the shortlisting process, which is common within national assessments centres.</li> <li>• Warwickshire Positive Action Lead is engaging with all of these candidates. Assessment centres take place in September.</li> </ul> <p><b>Staff</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 105 staff posts are accounted for in shared / hosted services.</li> <li>• There will be a change in the staff establishment in Sept 2021 with numbers lowering as shared / hosted services end.</li> </ul> <p><b>PCSO</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Turnover last month was three, with one leaving to join Warwickshire as a police officer and two others to other forces.</li> <li>• Planning intake for September to bring numbers back up</li> </ul>

	<p><b>Specials / Volunteers</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No change since last month, recruitment work continues in the background</li> <li>• Aspired target of approximately 130 Specials by end of 2021</li> </ul> <p><b>Action: AH to provide a breakdown on Volunteers for the next meeting</b></p>
